It's not too late to count yourself in

Mountain View County thanks rural residents for their co-operation during Census 2007.

With enumerators now back from the field, the focus turns towards tallying the information gathered over the month-long enumeration period. New census information must now be submitted to the Alberta government by Sept. 1, 2007.

Meeting this deadline is essential, as any increase in population beyond the figures gathered during the 2006 Canada Census submitted to the Province equals roughly \$1,000/ person in additional provincial funding. This is money that is essential for building and maintaining roads and infrastructure in our rapidly growing County.

In addition to the appropriate provincial funding which results from an accurate population count, the basic statistical data collected by enumerators is also essential when:

- Calculating cost-sharing agreements for areas such as recreation and fire protection;
- Indicating trends and growth patterns within the County, and;
- Helping County planners make decisions to meet the growing needs of Mountain View County residents.

If we missed you during the initial enumeration period, Mountain View County will be contacting you to ask for the following information:

- Legal land description
- Rural address (if possible)
- The number of residents in your household
- The age of each household resident.

We remind you that residents will not be asked to identify themselves; and that no personal information regarding income, sex, race or religion will be collected by enumerators.

Ag Wire Round Up coming up

Start the third week of August off wired.

On Aug. 13, once you've had your morning cup of coffee, be sure to round up all of your waste or excess wire and bring it to the Didsbury Landfill.

From 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Mountain View Regional Waste Management Commission, in conjunction with Mountain View County, will be collecting barbed and strand wire to be recycled at their landfill site approximately two miles north of Didsbury, off of R.R. 2.0 and Twp. Rd. 31.4.

Be sure to come early, as farmers who recycle the first 32,000 kg. of wire will receive a credit of 10 cents per kg., courtesy of Mountain View County's Agricultural Service Board. To be eligible for the credit you must be a resident of Mountain View County.

If you plan to take part, please note:

- Barbed and strand wire must be rolled as tightly as possible.
- Wire must be free of debris (dirt, sod, posts, etc.)
- Once the first 32,000 kg. of wire has been delivered, the cost of disposal is 10 cents per kilogram

So take your coffee to go, and get be one of the first to dispose of your excess wire. For more information, please contact Lesley Lovell at (403) 335-3311.
