Narrative

1. This last quarter has seen the traditional summer leave pressures. We have also been assisting District operations by seconding Cst. Doug Cushon to Oyen to assist as they have lost 1 member to transfer and another to long term medical issues. This is a great opportunity for Doug to develop management skills that will assist us here later. Cpl. Beth Hoskin has taken a long term leave to raise her children. We will miss her leadership. Cst. Tanner Wills departed in June for Assumption Detachment. His youthful enthusiasm is missed, but the stories flow down from northern Alberta keeping him in touch with us. He was replaced by Cst. Lyle Korver.
2. This last quarter saw some excellent public relations, for us, and fundraising opportunities for Victim Services. Canada Day saw members in Red Serge in Olds and Bowden. The RCMP Musical Ride attended Olds. The members got to interact with the community and about \$4000 was raised for/by each of the community partners, Olds Agricultural Society, Olds Minor Football and Victim Services. Many members took part in a fund raiser for Olds Minor Hockey, to support players who cannot afford to play. Members attended the Olds College BBQ, the Grizzly's home opener and other events.
3. The summer has been steady, but the number of calls for service has been down. We are happy to note the reduction in almost all areas from last year, but note that we have had large "pockets" of impaired drivers which is concerning.
4. The Alberta Sheriffs are almost fully located in the Innisfail Traffic Services Office. We still see a bit of them at the beginning and end of their shifts. While they are not providing

the assistance to traffic enforcement in our area that they used to if we have special requests or functions, with notice they still work very hard to come and be part of our projects.

5. The next quarter will see a significant amount of change in manpower in Olds. We have 2 members likely to be transferred during it. We also will be focusing on a number of mandatory training needs.

6. Town of Olds has been presented with information from a speed zone study in Olds. The goal with the study is to provide Council with the information required to support smooth safe flow of both pedestrian and vehicle traffic in Olds. The study was conducted using a Provincial Traffic guide and the philosophy of the less variations, the better.
