## Get your spray on!

Mountain View County's Agricultural Service Board has four pasture sprayers available free of charge to producers.

### Highlights include:

- Capable of spraying a 30-foot span
- Equipped with an approximate 400 gallon tank, boomless nozzles and hand wand
- A slide-in, skid-mounted sprayer also available free of charge
- A 20% rebate is offered to landowners off the cost of labeled herbicides at recognized rates for the control of Tall Buttercup and Wild Caraway
- The reverse roadside spraying incentive program supplies landowners with a pasture sprayer and enough chemical to spray the headlands and a portion of the adjacent road allowance to a width of 16 feet
- Small area weed control and spot spraying assistance available as well

## Riparian Area Management Improvements Funding Available

Mountain View County has funding available for riparian area projects within the County. Eligible projects include riparian fencing, off-site watering systems, and creek crossings. Mandatory improvements as a condition of subdivisions on both Environmental Reserve Easements and Restricted Covenants, and voluntary projects on agriculturally zoned land may also apply for funding. Only the cost of materials is eligible for funding.

The County partners with the Alberta Conservation Association to provide this program.

The deadline for applications is June 30, 2011.

## Plant Exchange

As of June 2010 the Alberta Weed Control Act was updated and now includes many plants that may appear in your flowerbeds. These species of plants that appear on the Act have been found to be a problem due to their invasive nature and lack of native pests.

In the updated Act there are two categories of weeds **Prohibited Noxious** and **Noxious**. It is required by every landowner within a County or municipality to destroy Prohibited Noxious weeds and control Noxious weeds.

To help Mountain View County residents with these changes to the Weed Control Act, the County is offering a plant exchange program for any County landowners that have the following weed species currently growing in their flowerbeds:

### Prohibited Noxious

- Himalayan Balsam/Poor Man's Orchid - *Impatiens glandulifera* Royle (Pictured right)
- Flowering Rush - *Butomus umbellatus* L.
- Pale Yellow Iris - *Iris pseudacorus* L.
- Big Head Knapweed - *Centurea macrophala* Puschk. Ex Wild.



### Noxious

- Common Tansy - *Tanacetum vulgare* L. (Pictured right)
- Baby's Breath - *Gypsophilia paniculata* L.
- Creeping Bellflower - *Campanula rapunculoides* L.
- Yellow Clematis - *Clematis tangutica* Maxim. Korsh.
- Oxeye Daisy - *Leucanthemum vulgare* Lam.
- Dame's Rocket - *Hesperis matronalis* L.

## Weed Inspection Program



### A notice to all residents

The Mountain View County weed inspection program has begun and weed inspectors will be visible throughout the County looking for Prohibited Noxious and Noxious weeds.

The role of a weed inspector is to increase public awareness and involvement to help reduce the introduction and spread of weeds.

Inspectors provide guidance and information to landowners regarding the Weed Control Act, weed concerns, problems, escaped ornamentals and their impacts. The program aims to foster an expanded willingness to prevent and control weeds within the community.

Under the Weed Control Act weed inspectors are granted a right of entry, within reason, onto lands only. However, weed inspectors will always try to make contact with the landowner before entering the property.

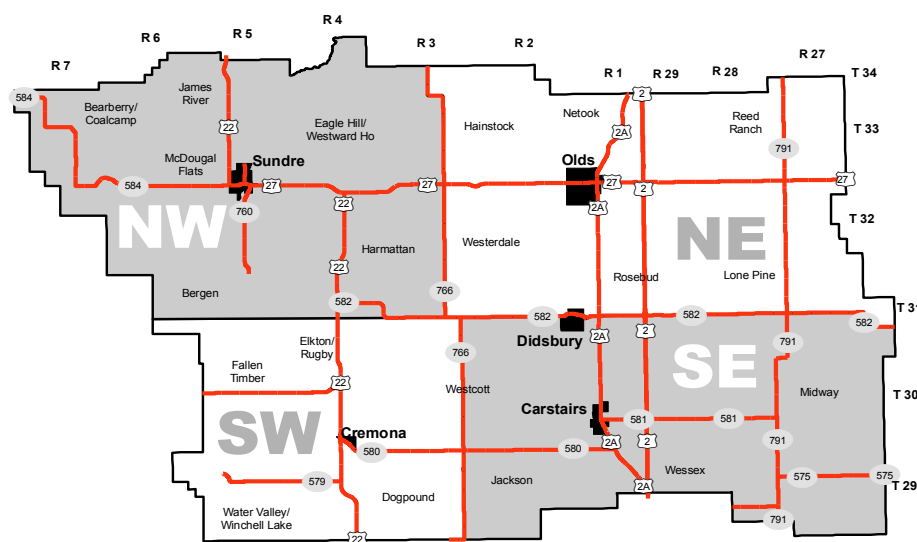
