## Weekly Weed Watch



### Scentless Chamomile

*(Tripleurospermum inodorum (L.) Sch. Bip.)*

Scentless Chamomile is not the chamomile used for tea, it can be an annual, biennial or a short-lived perennial. Scentless Chamomile is an overabundant seed producer. One large plant produces up to one million seeds that remain viable for up to 15 years. Its white daisy-like flowers can be seen at any time from May to October. The leaves are finely divided - similar to dill - growing erect to semi-erect, size ranging from 15 cm to 1 meter tall, and has a fibrous root system. Scentless Chamomile has been elevated from Noxious to Prohibited Noxious within Mountain View County.



### Oxeye Daisy

*(Leucanthemum vulgare Lam.)*

Oxeye Daisy is a non-native Noxious Weed often found in wild flower seed mixes. It features a single solitary white daisy flower, with spoon to oval shaped leaves featuring notched edges. Leaves grow smaller up the unbranching stem, which grows up to one meter tall. Shasta Daisy was bred from Oxeye Daisy and can revert back or hybridize with its weeding ancestor making it hard to distinguish and equally invasive.

These two weeds are often mistaken for each other. Though they have similar flowers the leaves are quite different.

## Get your spray on!

Mountain View County's Agricultural Service Board has four pasture sprayers available free of charge to producers.

### Highlights include:

- Capable of spraying a 30-foot span
- Equipped with an approximate 400 gallon tank, boom-less nozzles and hand wand
- A slide-in, skid-mounted sprayer also available free of charge
- A 20% rebate is offered to landowners off the cost of labeled herbicides at recognized rates for the control of Tall Buttercup and Wild Caraway
- The reverse roadside spraying incentive program supplies landowners with a pasture sprayer and enough chemical to spray the headlands and a portion of the adjacent road allowance to a width of 16 feet
- Small area weed control and spot spraying assistance available as well

**When-** From 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. weekdays

**Where-** Didsbury Landfill (two miles north of Didsbury off Range Road 20 and Twp. Rd. 314)

If you plan to take part, please note:

- Wire must be free of debris (dirt, sod, posts)
- Barbed and strand wire must be rolled as tightly as possible.
- Once we have received 50 tonnes of wire, the cost of disposal will be 10 cents per kilogram

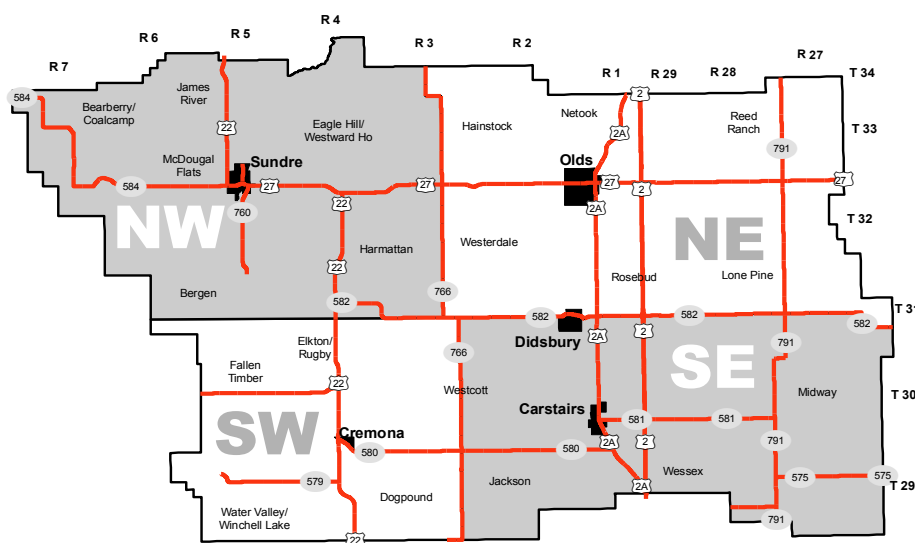
Mountain View County will cover the recycling costs for the first 50 tonnes of wire received from Mountain View County residents.
