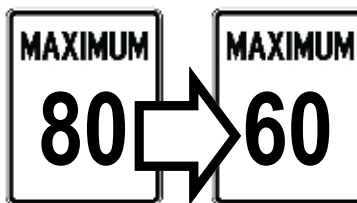

Attention County motorists



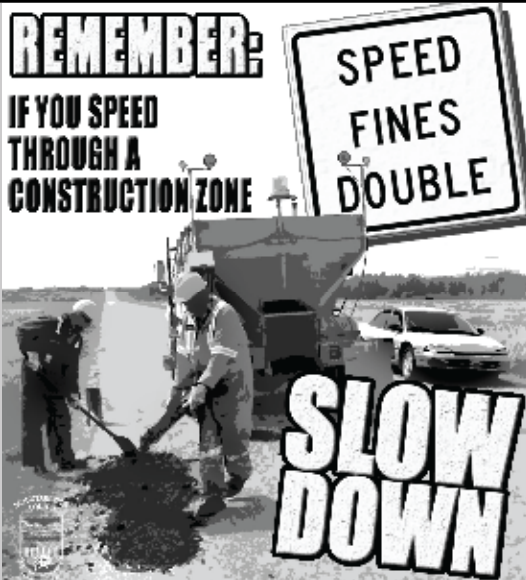
The speed limit on Township Road 312A from Range Road 15- East and westbound to Highway 2A- has been lowered from 80 km/h to 60 km/h effective immediately.
