Rising fuel costs impact Waste Collection rates

MVRWMC rate increase to impact County customers

The cost of solid waste collection for Mountain View County (MVC) is on the rise. In response to the rising cost of fuel, Mountain View Regional Waste Management Commission has notified customers, including Mountain View County, that they will be implementing a fuel surcharge on waste collection, effective August 1, 2008.

In order to compensate for the rising cost of solid waste collection, Mountain View County will be incorporating the fuel surcharge into County rates for the remainder of 2008.
