

16. SIGNAGE IN ROAD ALLOWANCES

Policy Statement:

Mountain View County will allow information signs to be placed within County road allowances under specified conditions.

Regulations:

1. All requests for installation of any sign in a road allowance requires approval by the Senior County Constable and the County Planning Department, where necessary.
2. Commercial Signage:
 - (a) Commercial signs must meet Mountain View County Land Use Bylaw requirements unless otherwise authorized by the Planning Department.
 - (b) Commercial operations shall be signed in accordance to Alberta Infrastructure specifications.
 - (c) Commercial signage will be installed by County personnel with all associated costs borne by the applicant.
3. Community/Church Groups Directional Signage:
 - (a) Community/Church Group facility directional signage will be done in accordance to Alberta Infrastructure specifications.
 - (b) This signage will be installed by County personnel with the applicant responsible for 50% of the actual cost of the signs and signposts.
4. Information/Awareness Signage
 - (a) Non-Conforming Signage
 - (i) Signs not meeting Alberta Infrastructure standards may be installed within County road allowances with the approval of the Senior County Constable.
 - (ii) Non-conforming signage will be installed by County personnel with all associated costs borne by the applicant.
 - (b) Non-Warranted Signage
 - (i) Signs considered non-warranted by the Senior County Constable may still be installed if they meet signage regulations approved by the Senior County Constable.
 - (ii) Non-warranted signage will be installed by County personnel with all associated costs borne by the applicant.

**SECTION F
GENERAL (16)**

5. Installation costs will include costs for County personnel and equipment for both installation and first calls and the actual cost of the signs and signposts.
6. Applicants are to pay installation costs in advance based on the County estimate with adjustments to the actual installation costs made following installation.

Background:

This policy is necessary to identify the parameters by which signs may be installed in County road allowances when requested by County organizations and residents.

The Land Use Bylaw refers to standards for installing signs.
