

Little Red Cross-country Trails: User Guidelines

Our mission is to provide opportunity and place for people to have outdoor recreation in winter.

1. We ski on four quarter sections of private land, at the benevolence of the owners. It is expected that we be respectful and thankful, sharing gracefully with others.
2. Parking: we are hopeful that the County will once again plow an off-road parking area. If parking on the road, ensure room for vehicles to pass.
3. Each of us is to manage our trash: carry in, carry out. Last year after snow melt, the trails were walked and there was virtually no trash.
4. There are two firepit and table areas. Fires in firepits only please.
5. Dogs are allowed. We are expected to have all dogs under control; dogs are not to harass wildlife or other users. Remove dog poo from trails.
6. No motorized vehicles. Please encourage any and all snowmobile or other vehicle operators to not travel on trackset trails.
7. Snowshoers are welcome. We will endeavour to have groomed space beside the trackset trails for snowshoes.
8. Pay to play: while we do not have a trail user fee, we rely on donations to offset the costs incurred. Funds are used to fuel and maintain snow machines, gift to land-owners, signage, purchase of miscellaneous needed items. If and when our bank account allows, we anticipate purchase of improved grooming equipment, perhaps provision of toilet facilities. Donations can be e-transferred to Luce Webb at lwebb@live.ca.
9. Skiing can be hazardous. We recommend that you carry bearspray, especially if not skiing in a group, as we share the space with a variety of wildlife.
